And so I think it is with you; your ideas mature gradually—let them grow, let them shape themselves, without undue haste.

#### From the Council President

Greetings Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

This month I would like take a few minutes to talk about St. John's finances. I will be using data from the most recent Treasurer's Report dated April 30, 2024.

Through April,2024, with income of \$143,057 and expenses of \$135,216 we have a positive balance of \$7,841. This compares to April, 2023, where we had a deficit of \$18,911. This is a remarkable improvement and I commend the Congregation for their generosity and the Ministry Teams for their fiscal responsibility.

Through April, 2024, offering is up over \$27,000 compared to April, 2023.

As we head into the summer months, where attendance and offering are typically lower, I would like to remind you that the Mission and Ministry of St. John's does not take a vacation. If you are traveling during that well earned vacation, please remember that we have both Venmo and Simply Giving available when you are unable to be present during regular services.

In conclusion, I am cautiously optimistic with the current state of St. John's finances, but don't want to see us in deficit territory at the end of the summer months.

# Notes from the Organ Bench

As I am writing this month's article, we have just finished today's service which was centered on the mustard seed and how mighty things come from the smallest seeds. All of today's music was focused on growth, even the offering hymn, As the Grains of Wheat. This hymn is the offering hymn for the entire summer and today it really matched the readings.

I have been planning service music for over 35 years and have seen much change. We now have resources to guide our planning. Most of the time this makes things easy, but there are some things that I really have to think through the planning. My husband complains that I ask too many questions, but this is how I understand. I need to have and sort through the information to make a decision.

One of the things in our liturgy that I am still struggling to understand is the offering hymn. When I was growing up, the Doxology was used every week. Period. Over time the hymns used for the presentation of the offering reflected stewardship, giving to God our monetary gifts. Sometimes food would be brought up, too. When my great-niece was baptized in the Catholic church, she was presented along with the monetary gifts and the communion elements.

In worship today, our offerings and offering hymn are included in the MEAL part of the service. As the *Grains of Wheat* talks about the grains being gathered (like our offering) as well as the people being gathered in God. I can see the presentation of our gifts in the refrain, but the verses are definitely speaking about communion- God's gift to us. I am learning...slowly.

So, back to the mustard seed. From the mustard seed comes great things. Registrations are slowly coming in for the music camps. **The Campette for children who have completed kindergarten through grade 2 is being offered from 9 am to noon on July 29<sup>th</sup>-31<sup>st</sup>.** If you know any children of this age who enjoy singing, moving, making and playing instruments, please spread the word.

We are hoping to resurrect the Musical Camp this summer. It is a totally immersive experience for students who have completed grades 3-8 and is being offered from 9 am to 2 pm, August 12<sup>th</sup>-16<sup>th</sup>. Registrations are slowly coming in and we may be presenting a scaled-back musical, but I promise a mighty result. These children always amaze me with their enthusiasm, energy, creativity and accomplishments. Please encourage any child you know who might be interested.




#### SAVE THE DATE

We will officially welcome new members on Sunday, August 18th during the 10 am service.






